## ANALYSIS OF 14 TEXAS CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT PROPOSITIONS NOVEMBER 7, 2023 ELECTION

To start off, I would like to encourage you to do your own research on these amendments. We have to become educated constituents of our government. Do your own research and come to your own conclusions. Here's some guidelines on how I have been able to effectively research constitutional amendments in Texas:

- 1. Read the bill the ballot item is based on. At least read the whole proposition not just the 'title' on the ballot.
- 2. See who is supporting and who is opposing the measure. What legislators wrote the bills this Proposed Constitutional Amendment is based on? What other bills did they author or sponsor during session? This tells you if they are a Democrat who has dramatically different values than you do, or if they are a "RINO Republican In Name Only" or if they align with your conservative values & ideals.
- 3. **Most critically, see who is funding the measures**. A great example is the text message I received two days ago encouraging me to Support Propositions 6, 7 and 8. This text message was sponsored by Texans for Opportunity who I'm not familiar with. As I began to look at the people on their board I did not get any red flags but I dug further into where their contributions were coming from and I found that Texans for Opportunity received **\$250,000** from Sands Hotel and Casino of Las Vegas and **\$25,000** from Texans for Lawsuit Reform (TLR). You remember in May that research showed TLR was a major player in funding the Impeachment attempt of Paxton. That alone may give you reservations about supporting Proposition Number 6, 7 and 8.
- 4. **Think about the philosophy behind what you are reading**. Does it promote Liberty and Capitalism or does it take taxpayer money to further government control and give certain specific businesses an advantage because that is a principle of Socialism.
- 5. Also, what are key phrases in the text? If it talks about 'animal rights' could that be part of the Green New Deal where animals will eventually have more rights than humans?
- 6. If you are still not sure seek out experts. Even after 4 sessions (8 years) of working on issues in the legislature I didn't feel equipped to give advice to other people, so I interviewed experts, watched videos, and read articles from people on both sides of the issues.
- 7. Watch what you're being fed because their PR is dangerous to your health. The other side is masterful at doing things like naming a tax increase the Prosperity for Americans Act. It sounds good But Stop and Consider- is taking money from your pocket a positive thing for you? It might be for a certain Special Interest group but not for 'you or Americans'.

## **POSITION RATIONALE:**

I am sure that my position on this amendment comes as quite a surprise and is the opposite of what you had expected. I would ask that you please read my explanation fully and come to your own conclusion. In my research on this proposition, I have, at times, felt really conflicted. As I was doing my research, I continued having second thoughts about supporting this amendment, yet I still did not feel that I knew enough to recommend you vote in opposition to the opinions of such prominent and trusted entities like the farming & ranching industry associations, our own <u>District 28 State Senator Charles Perry</u>, and our <u>Agriculture Commissioner</u>, <u>Sid Miller</u>. So, in order to resolve my conflicts, I dug deeper and followed the same advice that I have given you above about researching for yourself. The following is my comprehensive research and it has convinced me to vote against Proposition 1.

## RIGHT FROM THE START, I AM SUGGESTING THAT YOU STRONGLY CONSIDER VOTING AGAINST THIS PROPOSITION OR THE FOLLOWING REASONS:

- 1. **Most of the farming and ranching industry associations are in favor of it!** It seems counterintuitive because if the NCBA (<u>National Cattlemen's Beef Association</u>) is in favor of Proposition 1 you would assume they would be on the side of the small farmer and rancher but they are not.. Read on...
- 2. The proposition is being pushed by the <u>Texas Farm Bureau</u>. I was told that under current law, if the home I live in is on my farm or my homeowner's insurance policy covers the entire property. In contrast to that, if Proposition 1 passes, then I will be required to buy a specific insurance policy for my farm or ranch separate from my homeowner's insurance policy (this fact is "conveniently" beneficial to Texas Farm Bureau that sells just such insurance). Let me be clear, I heard that from only one source, and I haven't independently confirmed that fact. What I do know is that according to a 2017 Academic Report, 88% of <u>S&P 500 companies</u> are owned by <u>BlackRock</u>, <u>Vanguard</u>, and <u>State Street</u>, and that includes the <u>Texas Farm Bureau</u>. This means these three companies have significant influence over the business decisions and strategies of the companies they have majority ownership in, which may in turn affect the level of competition and consumer welfare in the market. These are the same financial firms that loan money to countries based on their <u>E.S.G. Scores</u> (Environmental Social Governance Score) which take into account how much emphasis a company places on environmental

issues, social justice concerns, and corporate governance. Understand that Texas Farm Bureau is one of the main proponents of Proposition 1.

- 3. The "protected rights" in this proposition will not limit the legislature's ability to use Eminent Domain to take your private property.
- 4. The amendment has <u>Biden 2030 Agenda</u> language built into it, that is, <u>Biden's 2030 agenda</u>, which is for the government <u>take over 30% of private property and agricultural land by the year 2030</u>. This was confirmed at the Stop 30 x 30 Summit.
- 5. **The Oklahoma State Legislature defeated a bill with nearly the same wording a few years ago**, and after educating the public on the dangers of government overreach this amendment could cause and the potential dangers to individual farmers and ranchers, they defeated the measure by 60+%.
- 6. <u>RCALF USA</u> head Shad Sullivan states that "Proposition 1 protects antitrust violators from being prosecuted and AFB (American Farm Bureau) and TFB (Texas Farm Bureau) are all for this. I was called a misinformation spreader by a Farm Bureau representative, a NCBA (<u>National Cattlemen's Beef Association</u>) representative, a TSCRA (<u>Texas and Southwestern Cattle Raisers Association</u>) representative, and a TCFA (<u>Texas Cattle Feeders Association</u>) representative. The are all using the small farmers & ranchers to get everything they want. These organizations are the front men spreading the propaganda." Now consider that due to consolidation in the beef industry, there are now <u>4 meat packing companies in the US that control 85% of the market</u>. Can you say 'monopoly'? Are you beginning to understand how this will benefit 'Big Ag' but can dramatically hurt the individual farmers and ranchers. Last year we estimate that 14,700 individuals sold their farms and ranches and the number is expected to be higher this year.
- 7. Lastly, this proposition states that the amendment gives the legislature the ability to step in and "protect public health and safety." Unfortunately we all remember what happened <u>last time government</u> stepped in to protect out health and safety!. Five years ago we might have read that and had no idea how a phrase that sounded like it was an innocuous protection could ultimately cause so much damage to every aspect of our lives. We need to see these other phrases that give government the right to intervene for the dangers they are!

The resolution states that government has the right to intervene:

- to protect "public health and safety"
- to prevent "danger to animal health or crop production"
- to "preserve or conserve natural resources"
